How short did you get the question interval?</p>	<p><b><u>ART &amp; DESIGN</u></b> <b>Drawing a 3D room plan</b> Becci Sharkey demonstrates how to draw a 3D room plan and an overhead floor plan, using the example of a bedroom with simple furniture. This clip could be used as part of work on Computer Aided Design, where children can design their own bedroom or room in their ideal home, adding specific 3D items to scale. The children could draw their classroom using the clip to assist, firstly having a go at the bedroom that the presenter has drawn, then moving on to their own room.</p>
